With expertise in Sexual Diversity Studies and Women & Gender Studies, Dr. Davies, a queer, feminist, and interdisciplinary critical scholar, has a diverse research platform and interests, including accessibility and inclusion in relation to gender, sexuality, and disability. Dr. Davies utilizes queer and poststructural theories to analyze systems of gender and sexuality, in particular as it relates to youth.

Dr. Schuurman specializes in health geography and, through her work in health informatics and critical GIScience, developed a methodology to map spatial access to health and other services.
