Updates on Partnership Grant

We received feedback from an expert panel of peer reviewers on Monday, February 6th, and had until Friday, February 10th to provide a 3-page written response to SSHRC.

The feedback was overwhelmingly positive:

If the partnership is successfully enacted, the results will not only yield significant advancements for the health and well-being of TGD Canadians but will also position Canada as a global knowledge and practice leader in this arena."
