Addressing the Need to Educate Service Providers on Trans-Affirming Postsexual Assault Care: An E-Learning Curriculum

Our newest publication overviews the uptake of the revised and updated *Providing Trans-Affirming Care for Sexual Assault Survivors* curriculum. From May 11, 2021, to March 27, 2022, 125 learners accessed the curriculum, with the overwhelming majority located in Canada (86%) and, specifically, in Ontario (53%).

Research in Progress

- We are in the process of completing analyses of the 2nd iteration of our survey determining research priorities for sexual assault and intimate partner violence among transgender persons.
- Our first paper using data from PARTNER network analysis conducted last summer has been accepted for publication. The paper, exploring community-engaged research during the COVID-19 pandemic, will be forthcoming in PLOS One.
