PREFACE

Trans communities are significantly impacted by physical and sexual violence. In Ontario, approximately 20% of trans persons report lifetime experiences of sexual and/or physical violence as a direct result of their gender identity (Bauer & Scheim, 2015). Despite this, many trans persons delay or avoid seeking the care they need due to past and/or anticipated experiences of stigmatization, discrimination, and mistreatment in healthcare settings (Bauer, Scheim, Deutsch, & Massarella, 2014). Furthermore, while most trans services and supports are located in metropolitan Toronto, a reported 68% of trans Ontarians reside outside this region (Bauer, Michelle, Todd, Matthias, Scanlon, & Travers, 2010).

There is a clear and pressing need for province-wide, intersectoral action to address the issue of sexual assault against trans persons. To meet this need, Dr. Janice Du Mont of Women's College Research Institute, Women's College Hospital has been collaborating with Egale Canada and the Ontario Network of Sexual Assault/Domestic Violence Treatment Centres (SA/DVTCs) on the trans-LINK Project – a multiphase initiative devoted to the development of a provincial intersectoral network on trans-affirming practice to better support sexual assault survivors.

The trans-LINK Project began with seven regional meetings held across Ontario during the summer of 2019. We travelled to Toronto, Mississauga, North York, London, Ottawa, Sudbury, and Thunder Bay to engage service providers across sectors in the task of collectively envisioning a more comprehensive, sensitive, and affirming response to sexual violence against trans communities. Since our initial meetings, the trans-LINK Network has continued to expand and evolve. We have built new collaborative partnerships; devised a clear and focused mission, vision, and set of values; delivered numerous presentations to key healthcare, social service, and policy stakeholders; disseminated articles, research briefs, infographics, among other knowledge exchange tools we have developed; and secured funding to ensure the continued growth and sustainability of the network.

As part of our ongoing efforts to foster connection and collaboration, this directory includes important information listed for every SA/DVTC and community organization represented across the trans-LINK Network. Listings include a brief summary of services as well as up-to-date contact information to aid in consolidating partnerships and making safer and more seamless referrals across sectors and regions.

Our hope is that this resource is of use to those providing services and other supports to trans survivors of sexual assault across Ontario, as well as to survivors themselves. We encourage you to use and share this directory to broaden professional networks within and across regions of the province in order to better serve trans persons who have experienced sexual assault.
